## Tractor, Product Of Keyser, Being Displayed In Bank

You've heard of the bull in the china shop and the dog in the manger, but Keyser has a tractor in a bank.

On display in the National Bank of Keyser is one of the "Tiger Tractors" that are being assembled at the local branch of the Inexco Corporation. Located in the "old silk mill building" on East S., the local assembly plant is known as the Piedmont Tractor Division of the Inexco Corp.

Nearly 100 of the small five-horsepower tractors have been assembled in Keyser, local manager John F. Somerville, Jr., has announced. All persons interested in seeing Keyser's newest product are invited to visit the National Bank.

The tractor is a versatile machine that plows, cultivates, harrows, cuts grass and hay, rakes hay, plows snow, hauls loads up to four tons, grades, and performs other duties.

It is 64 inches long with a wheel base of 46 inches, up to 40 inches wide and 36 inches high. The operator sits on the tractor, which is powered by a five-horsepower Briggs-Stratton motor.
